

EXTENSION OF PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE ORDER

The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services for the State of Oregon, acting under the authority in ORS 731.870, issued an order effective March 25, 2020 through April 23, 2020, directing all insurers transacting insurance in Oregon to extend deadlines for reporting claims, institute grace periods for premium payment, suspend cancellations and non-renewals, and provide other specified relief to Oregon insureds. On April 23, 2020 the director extended the duration of the order to be in effect through May 23, 2020.

The director issued a Property and Casualty Insurance Order to all insurers transacting property and casualty insurance in Oregon, effective May 24, 2020 through June 22, 2020, which extended and modified the relief insurers are to provide to Oregon insureds and terminated the March 25, 2020 order for property and casualty insurers. On June 22, 2020 the director extended the duration of the Property and Casualty Insurance Order to be in effect through July 22, 2020.

The director has determined that the COVID-19 outbreak in Oregon, which resulted in a state of emergency,¹ continues to substantially interfere with the public's ability to carry on its normal course of business. The director, therefore, extends the duration of the Property and Casualty Insurance Order to be in effect through July 31, 2020.
